


So thankful for our bus ministry as we strive to build our children's Sunday School classes as well as our Children's Church. This is our children's preschool Sunday School which is growing!

Provision in the Wilderness

Nehemiah 9:20-21

Our journey with God can take us through some pretty amazing places resplendent with earthly blessings. But it also often leads through the wilderness—hard, inhospitable places where happiness shrivels and hopes dry up and all our energy seems consumed in the quest for survival. One look at such a barren, howling waste, and we want to scurry back to lush gardens and mountain top vistas. We beg God to change routes. And sometimes He does. But sometimes He doesn't. Sometimes, instead of taking us out of the wilderness, He provides for us there.

After rescuing the Israelites from Egypt, God led them into the desert, where they eventually stayed for forty years. They faced hardship after hardship and often struggled to see the goodness of God in the desolation around them. But when they and their descendants looked back on their wilderness experience, they saw a story of God's faithfulness. God kept them in the desert, but He never abandoned them or failed to sustain them.

In our own figurative wilderness, He does the same for us. Instead of taking us to fertile grain fields, He feeds us manna in the middle of a wasteland. Instead of loitering along a river, He opens a spring in a rock or draws sweetness from a bitter well. He makes the clothes on our backs outlast our travels and keeps the only pair of feet we've got from swelling. He doesn't make us stay in the desert forever. But He also doesn't stop being our God right where we are. As long as we're with Him, He'll provide for us.

So when you find yourself in the wilderness, by all means ask the Lord to let you out. Be honest with Him about how you feel. But if He asks you to follow Him onward through the desert, know that He'll take care of you there. He'll bring good out of this stage of your journey, and will even produce goodness in the middle of it.

Keep walking with Him. He loves you.
