

Redeeming the Wasteland

Isaiah 45:18

Sometimes, life seems more like a wasteland than a flourishing garden. When it does, we might wonder why a good, life-giving God opens up deserts in His people's lives. Recently, an almost parenthetical phrase in Isaiah 45:18 jumped out at me. The entire verse introduces the LORD as the world's Creator and only God. Amid this introduction, almost as a side note, the writer says, "he did not create it [the earth] to be a wasteland, but formed it to be inhabited." (CSB)

Maybe that's why God sends His people into wastelands. Maybe He wants to use us to bring life to the desert. To carry hope into the hospital, love into the broken family, peace into the difficult work situation, joy and contentment into the financial hardship. Church, God's Spirit dwells in each of His children. Maybe, through us, He wants to bring His presence to uninhabited places. I don't know why the wastelands have to exist to begin with. I just know our God loves redemption. And He loves working with and through His people.

So, as you navigate your wilderness, ask God to use you to bring His kingdom into it. Ask Him to help you walk this hard road in a way that glorifies Him and blesses others. Invite the Holy Spirit to work in and through you. And when you can see no signs of life or goodness around you, ask the LORD to show up with His miraculous grace and redemption. Persevere through the hardship, knowing that in God's hands your wasteland won't be wasted.








We observed **Veteran's Day** on Sunday, November 9th by honoring military veterans of the US armed forces. Thank you to all those who have served to protect our country!
