
OUTREACH

Knowing God by Being Still

Knowing God by Being Still

Psalm 46:10

In the face of trouble or confusion, many of us have found comfort in the first words of Psalm 46:10—"Be still, and know that I am God ..." (KJV)

Acknowledging God's goodness and sovereignty allows us to experience peace during chaotic times. Because we know what God is like, we can trust Him amid the most tumultuous circumstances. Yet I believe there's another angle to this verse. These words come near the end of a psalm about God's role as Jerusalem's help in the face of war and upheaval. In verse 9, God puts an end to war. He then issues His command to "be still" to the fighting nations. Essentially, He's telling them to stop striving for control and acknowledge His supreme authority. Once they do, they'll have the opportunity to know Him as God—to witness His power and experience His rule. The same is true for us. When life gets chaotic, we're often tempted to grasp for control. We may feel responsible for saving ourselves or smoothing out our situation. But God is with us as our ever-present help in trouble. When we try to solve our problems by our own power, He reminds us to stop striving and let Him work for our good and His glory. Yes, God gives us roles to fill and parts to play in His story. But none of those include being God. None of us are called to manage all the logistics or outcomes in our lives. Instead, we're called to obey God while trusting Him to meet needs, direct our path, and handle the unknowns. When we do this, we get to witness our mighty, faithful God at work. We get to build a more trusting, intimate relationship with the One who holds us in His hands. So, when you face chaos, take a moment to breathe and check in with God. Ask Him for the guidance and provision you need to navigate the turmoil. Thank Him for always being present and always being God. Ask Him to be glorified during this difficult time. May He be exalted among the nations—and in our lives and hearts.
